<b>Music</b>	<b>Solar System</b> - Listening and identifying structures of a piece of music.	<b>At the Movies</b> - Composing a piece of music to accompany a short clip
<b>Geography</b>	<b>Alps</b> – Learning to describe the characteristics of the Alps and compare them to their local area. Our key question: What is life like in the Alps?	
<b>History</b>	<b>Tudors</b> – Learning to make deductions from historical evidence of the Tudors. Our key question: What was life like in Tudor England?	
<b>DT</b>	<b>Electrical systems</b> - Doodlers Explore electric circuits and apply this knowledge to design and make their own electric doodler.	
<b>Computing</b>	<b>iProgram</b> - Children will develop their computational thinking and programming skills by creating animations using Scratch.	<b>iDraw</b> - Children will use a variety of programmes and software to create graphical drawings.
